I want to recommend another event for members try to get to. It is the (free – apart from travel and accommodation) joint Europe Air Sports (EAS) / Eurocontrol conference day on Friday 17th April 2009 at the Eurocontrol building in Brussels. At this, EAS will be debating with Eurocontrol the strategic issues that affect air sports in the regulatory and technical developments concerning airspace and related equipment requirements. The same event two years ago was a great success and again it provides the opportunity, particularly as the EU Single European Skies initiative gathers pace, for the air sports community to engage with European institutions and their senior personnel on matters that are of crucial importance to maintaining our

freedoms in the future. The details of the event, and booking forms, will be available shortly through the RAeC email distribution system.

EASA's NPA 17 proposals on pilot licensing close for comments on 28th February. I urge everyone to respond to this consultation, as it is a window of opportunity to influence the outcome and which will affect pilots of light aeroplanes, helicopters, gliders and balloons that are within the scope of EU airworthiness regulation. The RAeC member associations are responding and most have guidance for their members on their websites on what issues are of particular importance to comment on. The volume of individual responses counts. Defence of the EASA proposals for medical standards for the Leisure Pilots Licence, very similar to the UK NPPL, is absolutely vital if we are to retain these in the EU context. I urge everyone to write in support for the standards, as this is equally as important as constructively criticising other aspects of the proposals. FAI AWARDS

In recognition of their World record flights last year, **Mark Jackson** and **Eve Jackson** have been awarded the FAI Ann Welch Diploma, which is given "to the pilot or crew of a Microlight who, in the opinion of CIMA, made the most meritorious flight which resulted in a microlight World record claim ratified in the year in question".

NEW BRITISH WORLD RECORD HOLDERS

Attila Balogh set new speed records in December, from Coventry to Le Mans and return, at 290 kph for the outward flight and 227 kph on the return.

With crew **Stephen Throup**, Attila also set new records in October from Coventry to Berlin at 294 kph and Berlin to Coventry at 219 kph. All these flights were completed in an SR22 by Cirrus.

Robin Hamilton has flown new speed and distance records in a Swift Light Aeriane hang-glider. His records for triangular distance of 302 km and speed over a triangular course of 49 kph were set last August in Texas.

BRITISH PILOTS AT INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS

European Skydiving League

Congratulations to the **Skydiving Team GB**, who won the title of ESL Champions at a meet at Texel in the Netherlands. The ESL consists of four separate competitions for 4-way teams at the four different levels of experience in skydiving. The teams took the gold medals in the AA and Rookie classes, silver in the AAA and AA classes and bronze in the A and Rookie class. The whole team won the overall title and the 'Spirit' – the sword that is awarded to the winning team. As winners, the UK now has the task of hosting the 2009 finals.

Speed Skydiving World Series

Well done to **Clare Murphy**, who was the 2008 ISSA women's champion, with an average speed of 431.33 kph. The average speed of each jump is calculated over a vertical kilometre and then the overall average from three jumps is taken for the purposes of the contest.

SCHOLARSHIPS and AWARDS

Air League Scholarships

The Air League Educational Trust offers flying scholarships to be flown in the summer of 2009. The awards are for 12-15 hours flying instruction. Air Cadets are eligible for a number of special awards.

Selection will be based on a formal application and, after short-listing, either an interview at the Trust's London office or aptitude tests and interview at RAF Cranwell around Easter 2009.

The competition is open to young people permanently resident in the UK who will have reached their 17th but not their 26th birthday on 1st April 2009.

Closing date for completed application forms is 31 January 2009.

The Air League also offers a variety of scholarships to enable young people to learn to fly powered aircraft, gliders or balloons, or for advanced power training. Scholarships are also available to provide engineering placements in the UK aerospace industry.

Closing dates are 28 February, with the exception of the flying scholarships towards the NPPL, for which the closing date is the end of January.

GAPAN

The Guild scholarships provide an opportunity for people who would like to become pilots or to further their qualifications as pilots. Several PPL (fixed wing) scholarships, a few FI(R) (both fixed wing and rotary) and 2 Jet Orientation course (JOC) scholarships are available for 2009. Closing dates are 9th April, with the exception of the JOC scholarship, for which the closing date is the end of August. European Mandatory Insurance

EC mandatory insurance requirements are based on the MTOM of an aircraft and are denominated in Special Drawing Rights (SDRs). In 2004, an SDR was worth £0.80, but the fall in the value of Sterling means that SDRs have increased in value. Aircraft owners should review their insurance to check that they are adequately covered.
