Clubs and schools are reminded for the need to advise the CAA annually if tow permissions are required for the following season. The closing date for 2008 Tow Permits is Friday 16th November 2007.

The renewal procedure has been revised to make the process easier for established sites. If a site is required for continued usage with no changes then it is now sufficient to send only an email notification to the FSC Tow Panel via russ.hicks@btopenworld.com

In order to expedite the removal of unused sites from the CAA database, non-receipt of renewal applications will result in the termination of a site permit on 31st December 2007.

New applications and renewals with changes should be submitted in the usual format on paper to the BHPA office.

Paul Sioffi has suffered the theft of a dark grey Niviuk rucksack containing his equipment from the luggage of a National Express coach travelling from Heathrow to Totnes, Friday 26th October. Included were a brand new medium Niviuk Artik (ser no C350534), a distinctive bright paulcioffi@blueyonder. red in colour with a small white section. The harness was a black and red Supair Evo XC with reserve fitted on the back (has 2 large distinctive tears on the underside) Also a black Supair flying suit (tears on leg), a flight deck with Flytech vario in it and a white open faced Lazer helmet.
